Isabel: “I thought about everything I know about Nadeen school, Bahrain, The Earth and The Planet!”



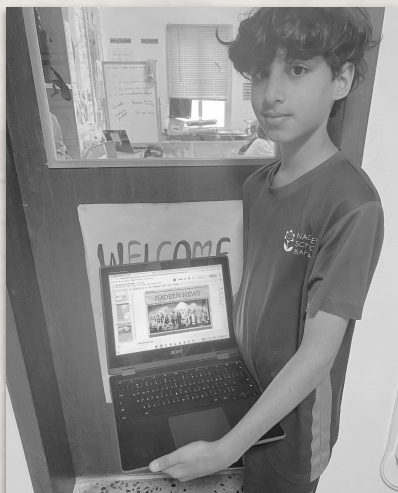

Exceptional students create this very newspaper

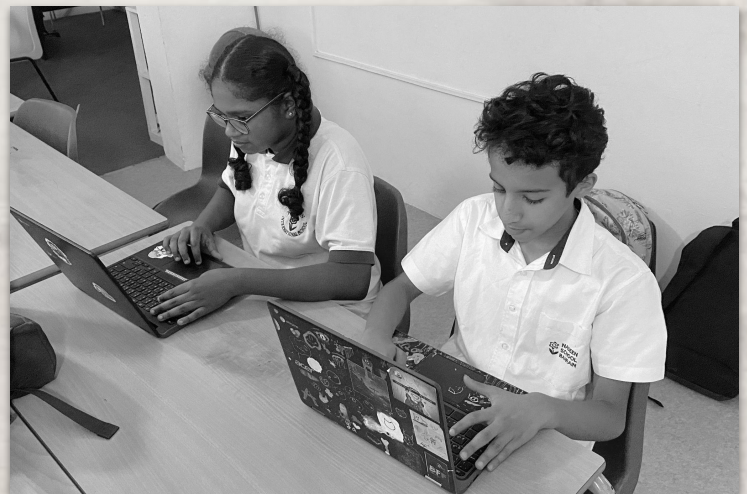
In an extraordinary display of talent, three committed students have written this very newspaper you are now reading. Their names are: Yousif, Jayashree and Abdulrahman.

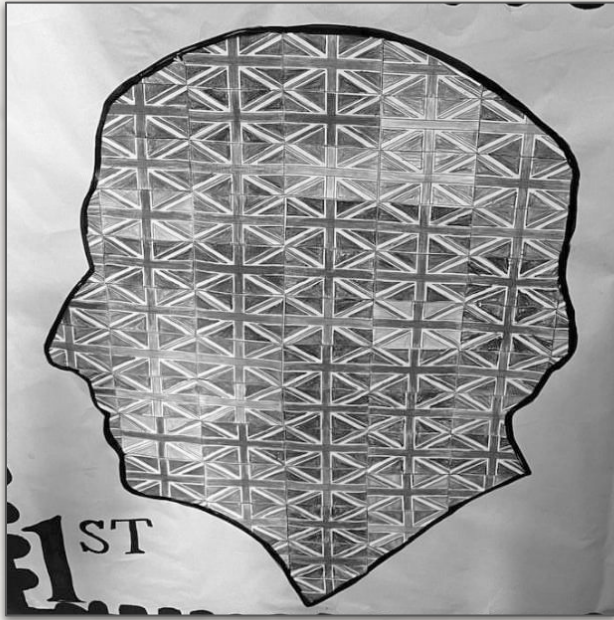

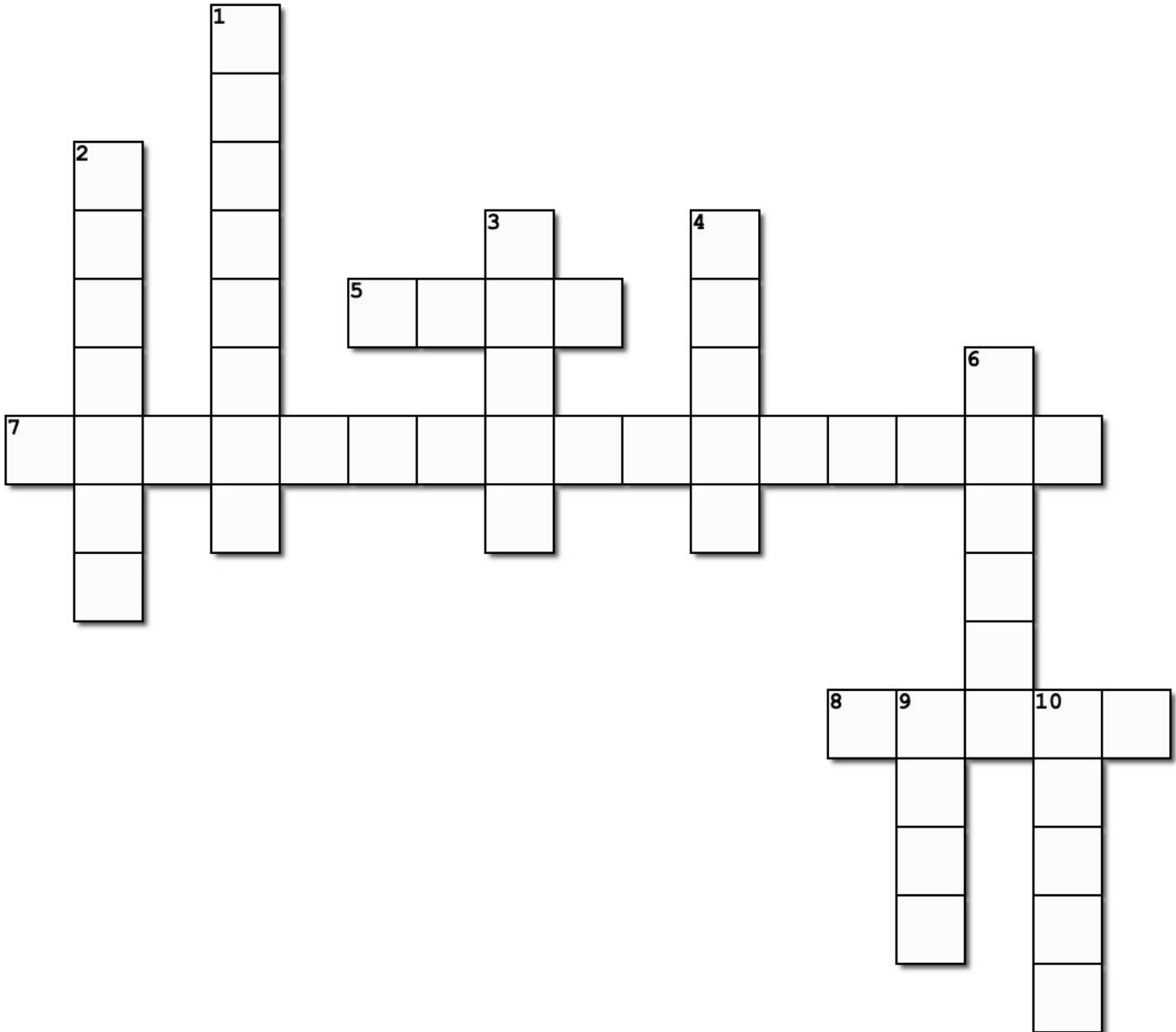
